Wellman construction update

Contract documents are signed. Original date was end of June / July. Note we need to review with outside inspectors at beginning of project, so we know what to inspect at end.

Bus Recommendation

*Pr. Steve moved to un-table bus discussion from previous meeting, Deb Mertz seconded. Motion passed. Recall work has been completed. Additional checks needed to identify issue with cylinder – if repair is minor, we will complete. Situation is that bus is depreciating and not utilized much. *Kaleb Headings moved to follow Property Committee's recommendation to sell the bus and put the money into transportation budget. Sale to be finalized by Executive Committee with coordination of Property Committee. Margy Headings seconded. Discussion ensued. Motion passed.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. *Linda Fogt moved to accept the report as submitted, Joyce Fishbaugh seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: A copy of the Treasurer's report was distributed with the agenda. *Tina Ike moved to approve as submitted, Joyce Fishbaugh seconded. Motion passed. Additional notes from Thomas: We can make 1st two payments to Wellman without borrowing from Memorial Committee. As a follow up from a question on rental income from last month, Alcoholics Anonymous pays \$50/month for basement space usage.


