


Happy December, Brothers and Sisters!!

November 13, 2023

CALL TO ORDER: President, Jacob Cook OPENING DEVOTION: Pastor Steve Edmiston

AGENDA REVIEW: Addition: New business: Holiday offerings, New Year's service schedule, Thrivent Choice dollars. *Margy Headings moved to approve as amended, Kaleb Headings seconded. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Council Replacements

Ann Hubler and Michelle Cavinder will be on the ballot. We would still like to target 2-3 more people.

Holiday Offerings

Three holiday offerings will be donated to special causes (Thanksgiving, Christmas Eve and Christmas day). *Pastor Steve moved to donate Thanksgiving offering to Compassionate Care and Christmas offerings to Mercy Mission House, Linda Fogt seconded. Motion passed. It was requested to include mission statements of those programs in the bulletin.

New Year's Eve Schedule

New Year's Eve is on Sunday. It was decided to keep the standard Sunday service schedule.

Thrivent Choice Dollars

Some congregants use the Thrivent Financial services and they can choose to have their Thrivent Choice Dollars paid out. Thrivent cannot designate the account those go to, instead those dollars are deposited into a standard Church Thrivent account. To move those dollars to a requested account, we require a motion be made to council. That can be accomplished by reaching out to any council member to make that request. *Linda Fogt moved to transfer \$82 choice dollars from Thrivent account to account #7045, Women of ELCA (quilting), Margy Headings seconded. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS

Budget review

Budget will be presented to congregation as approved in October meeting.

Annual Congregational meeting

Meeting will be held on Nov 19th after 9:30 service, to be followed by a pancake breakfast.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. *Linda Fogt moved to accept the report as submitted, Kaleb Headings seconded. Motion passed.

TREASURER'S REPORT: A copy of the Treasurer's report was distributed with the agenda. *Tina Ike moved to accept the report as submitted, Kaleb Headings seconded. Motion passed.

Additional notes from Thomas: Mary did not get reimbursed for September per her request and opted to leave those dollars in as a cushion for future months; staff is doing an excellent job of keeping under budget; we are overall under budget with operating expenses being low and property insurance being high; 2nd payment has been made on capital project, we will likely need to borrow against Memorial committee for 3rd payment; reminder that Vision Fund is for maintenance and Capital Fund is for Roof project. *Joyce Fishbaugh moved to have \$12,100 transferred from Vision Fund #7037 to Capital Improvement Fund # 7015, Wes Cavinder seconded. Motion passed.

STAFF REPORTS

Pastor Report: Renewal of wedding vows held; 90 min Bible review was held; Advent and Christmas activities being planned; Christmas weekend service schedule - Sun Dec 24 at 9:30a for 4th Sunday of Advent, 7pm and 11pm for Christmas Eve, and Mon Dec 25 9:30a for Christmas morning; Darin Davis requested a new wheelchair be procured that would better fit in elevator - Margy will check options and present at next meeting along with an AED unit; reverse advent calendar opportunity reviewed but not pursuing a this time; next month's council meeting is open to new members to review the structure and expectations; Pr. Steve will be out a week in January visiting relatives but will be back for Sunday services.

Volunteer Coordinator Report: No report submitted.

Thrift Shop Report: No report submitted. Per Linda, coat giveaway was successful on Nov 4th in the store. A total of 103 coats were given to 43 families. A big THANK YOU to Luther's Purse who purchased new coats on sale in the Spring to include in the give-away.

Outreach - Evangelism: Per Linda, Cards for Christ has 2700 so far - will drop off end of November, 34 Thanksgiving meals have been gathered and 34 families identified – there are 16 more bags possibly coming in, and 50 chickens being purchased from Davis Meats. A special note that this congregation is very generous!!

Outreach – Parish Life: Per Jen, review of pancake breakfast plans after annual meeting.

Operations – Finance: Per Thomas, reviewed and signed reports.

Operations – Property: Per Kaleb, met with Ed and Frank Langenkamp to review the project with Wellman Bros – they are satisfied that Wellman was doing a good job. Frank and Ed requested not to be paid and wanted to donate their services.

WELCOME AND OPENING DEVOTION: Pastor Steve Edmiston

CALL TO ORDER: President, Jacob Cook

QUORUM REQUIREMENT: Quorum of 50 voting members required to hold meeting. Confirmed by count, 70 present.

FINANCE REVIEW: Presented by Treasurer Thomas Martin via hand outs and monitors.

THANK YOU to Congregation for their generosity.

Capital project update: Wellman completed phase 1 of project for the exterior. \$62,000 was raised with no loan. We would like to verify outside has no leak issues before starting Phase 2 for the interior next Spring/Summer. A reminder that donations need to be designated to Capital Project, NOT Building fund (which is for standard maintenance).

Budget Proposal:

Goal is to keep at same level as 2023.

Great job this year from congregation and staff to fund and stay in budget.

Reviewed breakdown of areas. Budget is overall just under last year's by \$130.

Ouestions:

What is Synod support about? Answer: Synod requests funds from churches to help fund their budget – we typically budget a 3% increase per year. They usually ask for more, but we keep it at 3% and vote in council whether to provide extra at end of year if we have the buffer. Interior work details? Work will be done on interior damage that was caused by leaking of exteri-

or such as plaster repair on ceilings etc.

*Kermit Dorsey moved to accept the Budget proposal as presented, Dwayne Mullen seconded. Motion

NEW COUNCIL MEMBERS: Those going off council are Jacob Cook, Joyce Fishbaugh, Linda Fogt, and Tina Ike. Jacob Cook reviewed those who have agreed to join council: Ann Hubler and Michelle Cavinder. Myron Koester volunteered to join for a 3 yr term. Tina Ike spoke to the benefits of joining council. *Steve Holt moved to accept the 3 nominees onto council, Kermit Dorsey seconded. Motion passed. We ask congregation to prayerfully consider joining council as we would like to have 1 additional person to keep at the same number we have this year.
