We also received some first aid supplies which we forwarded to Compassionate Care of Shelby County. This organization is located across from the post office and is a faith-based healthcare center. It provides quality care and hope to the uninsured and underserved in our community.

We were also able to provide sheets to the St. John's quilters. They use this fabric to make quilts which are then sent where needed by Lutheran World Relief.

AGENDA REVIEW: Reviewed and to include discussion of which organization to give Lenten and Easter services offerings to and whether the next meeting should take place April 8, 2024 due to that being the date of the total eclipse of the sun and all the traffic issues associated with that. Kaleb Headings motion to approve the amended agenda and Myron Koester seconded the motion. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Discussed where to donate Lenten and Easter offerings. Last year was given to New Choices. Considering Motherhood Reclaimed Ministries. Jen Maier will check into this ministry closer and will report back to council next meeting so a decision can be made regarding these funds.

Since the eclipse is earlier in the day, it was not felt that the meeting would be impacted so meeting to remain April 8, 2024 at 7:00.
