The presence of Jesus is a daily part of our lives. Sharing the love of God can be just as common, just as regular and this is where Jesus is leading us.


May the Bread of Life, fill you this month as we strive to bring the goodness of God's love to the world around us.





Along with the pastor and the staff, volunteers who prepare for the Saturday and Sunday services park in the lot each week. There are council meetings, Bible studies and vacation Bible school. The quilting and circle ladies are there each month. Three days a week, the parking lot fills up at noon when AA meets in the church basement. While St. John's members park in the Senior Center lot on Sundays, some Senior Center members use the St. John's lot during the week. Add to all of this the St. John's Thrift Shop...Community members stop by the Thrift Shop on a regular basis to drop off boxes and bags of donations. AGENDA REVIEW: Kaleb moved to add to New Business and Old Business (see below additions). Seconded by Margy. Motion passed

NEW BUSINESS:

Council will need to search for council treasurer replacement. Suggested that the position be posted (Pastor will search for previous posting answered by Thomas and email to Kaleb). Council also, to give thought to replacement and make suggestions accordingly. There is a small compensation for this position. The amount was unknown and was to be researched.

Jeff Fannon is willing to fill in until a replacement can be found. Kaleb moved to add Jeff to the account signature card. Pastor Steve seconded and motion passed.

-Thomas had started a process of collecting budgetary suggestions. Myron is willing to sort through these. This process will be re-posted with an alternate email.

Pastor Steve moved to cancel July meeting as has been the standard in the past unless there was urgent business during that month (a meeting could rescheduled if unexpected business does need to be addressed). Kaleb seconded the motion and motion passed.

Memorial Committee had been reviewing bylaws and saw there is supposed to be a Audit Committee reviewing Memorial Committee's and Council books. This can be the same committee that audits both but can not contain Memorial Committee or Church Council members. This has not been done recently. 3 yr term so to develop this initial committee, a 1 yr, 2 yr, and 3 yr fill will be needed. Each can do 1 time second term. This group will need to meet 1-2 times per year (more if deemed necessary). Their report will included in the annual report. Council to consider candidates for this position.

OLD BUSINESS:

Kaleb has yet to set a date for AED training with the fire chief. Looking at an evening in August or September. This will depend on when the fire chiefs is available. This date will be announced when set.

There is not a recent quote for interior work. Kaleb will get this and check for start date. Pastor Steve pointed out that Cody Blust's wedding is set for August 31, 2024 so would like to avoid scaffolding and work being done during that.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. Kaleb moved to approve as submitted and Ann seconded. Motion passed.




