While watching news stories of war, poverty and natural disasters throughout the world, it's difficult sometimes to imagine how we can help those who are suffering in such far-off places. But Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts give us a tangible way to show God's love to those in need both near and far with warm quilts made by caring hands.

In February of 2023, an extremely powerful earthquake struck central Turkey and surrounding areas. It is estimated that 1.5 million people were left homeless. The Lutheran World Relief website features a touching video of Leyla from Antakya, Turkey. She and her family are among those who lost their homes. Following the earthquake, she and her family only had a make shift home constructed of a tent and tarps to protect them from the elements. They lived this way for nearly a year. The Lutheran World Relief Mission Quilts they received during that time wrapped them in love, peace and warmth and let them know that they were not forgotten.

On September 28th and 29th, we will ask God to bless 68 quilts and those who receive them. These quilts were lovingly made by those of us here at St. John's. These quilts will eventually be received by someone like Leyla. We may never meet those who receive these quilts but we can pray for them and share a little love and warmth through these quilts.

CALL TO ORDER: Pastor Steve Edmiston **OPENING DEVOTIONS:** Pastor Steve Edmiston

AGENDA REVIEW: Motioned to approve as submitted by Margy and seconded by Wes. Motion passed

NEW BUSINESS:

Hire of treasurer Dave Bollheimer. Two candidates were interviewed by telephone and in person by Pastor Steve and Kaleb. Dave was chosen as the best fit. Dave introduced himself and gave his background in finance. Margy moved to accept recommendation for hire of Dave Bollheimer for church council treasurer. Norb seconded the motion. Motion passed. Jeff Fannon was thanked for assisting during the interim.

The church basement kitchen garbage disposal had malfunction a while ago and has been mistakenly used a couple of times. This has been labor intensive to correct and Bob is requesting replacement. When the kitchen was redone, a commercial grade disposal was used. Therefore, the replacement must be of the same grade. A bid from Tom & Jerry Plumbing (Ft Loramie) was received for \$2400 to purchase and \$600 to install (total \$3000) for replacement. Norb moved that the bid be accepted and Deb seconded the motion. Motion passed. Norb motioned that the fund be taken from the building fund and John seconded the motion. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Committee budgets need to be completed and turned in by September. Typically these are edited in October and presented to the congregation in November.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Tatum motioned to approve as submitted and Michelle seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURE'S REPORT: A copy of the Treasurer's report was distributed with the agenda. This was reviewed by Jeff Fannon.

1. Request committee budgets turned in next month. These can be emailed to him.

2. Landon has not billed for lawn care services since Thomas' passing. Pastor Steve/Wes will reach out to him to request he send a bill for services.

3. Jeff clarified the purpose of capital funds. Explained that interior work was not yet been done and has not been definitively scheduled. Kaleb not present to update on this timing.

4. Investment funds continue to grow.

5. Funds coming from Thrivent Choice Dollars cannot allocated to a certain group. A request was made by Connie Cotner that \$82 that she had allocated to St. John's would go to the quilting team. It was moved by Margy and seconded by John to allocated these funds. Motion passed. It was explained that the funds would go to Joy Circle. When the quilt team made a purchase the receipt was submitted to Joy Circle and the buyer was reimbursed.

STAFF REPORT:

• Pastor Report-

1. Pastor had a wonderful trip to Minnesota

2. VBS went really well

3. Pastor spent a significant amount of time reviewing resumes, telephoning and interviewing treasure candidates

4. Eleventh Street Baptist Church - Lima sent a thank you for the van that was donated to them.

5. Congregational meeting in Nov so all must be thinking of candidates for council to replace those that have served for 3 yrs.

6. Blessing of the pets August 25. Open to the community and any animal as long as owners are able to control (including horses)

Pastor is beginning to work on Advent and Christmas.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

- *Ministry Education & Youth:* Vacation Bible School went well. Will start planning a fall outing Ministry - Music & Worship: Becky passed on some concerns/suggestions that she had received. 1. Acoustics making it hard for some individuals to hear during services and congregational meeting. The speakers had not been recently checked and it was felt that it would be a good time to repeat this process (going to each speaker individually to identify if working). It was pointed out that some areas such under the balcony would be more muted so if someone sitting there was having difficulty hearing, they should consider moving to a different location. Will try to do a better job getting the microphone to anyone speaking during congregational meeting. 2. Suggested a Wellness Committee (a committee that checks on and speaks with former members). Pastor Steve pointed out that he would support a group that wanted to do this. He recommended that Becky pass on to those that suggested this to develop a committee for this purpose. He did, however, feel that individuals that know those that have left would be far more effective in reaching out to these individuals and suggested that course of action over committee development. 3. There are individuals that are unhappy because rarely see the entire congregation due to multiple services. Pastor Steve pointed out that the best resolution of this would be for those individuals to attend various services. To have only one service would create too great of dissatisfaction within the church. It was also recommended that these individuals attend "Donut Sunday" between two Sunday services the first Sunday of the month. Deb reported that the bell choir would be meeting Sept. 15th and will be playing at services in Oct (date unknown)
- *Outreach Evangelism:* Will be purchasing cards for Cards for Christ program. Will start set up for Thanksgiving meal in Oct. Still working on Car show idea.
- Outreach Parish Life: August 25 will have the blessing of pets (in courtyard near the cross).
- Operations Finance: Committee budgets requested by Sept
- *Operations Property:* Continues to work on picnic table across from Chilly Jilly's. Has had to remove the trash can near the table because too many would throw trash near the can but not in. Now since moved over to Chilly Jilly's, people are taking their trash to it.




This retreat is free of charge. A complimentary lunch will be provided by Do Good.


