
HOLY WEEK

Even winter can bring hope as we hope for the return of spring. Hope is something we can cling to all the time, but it is from what we celebrate this April that all hope for our lives springs.

As spring came in late March, we were already in our season of Lent, the springtime for our souls. As we move in to April, we continue our Lenten journey, moving toward Holy Week and ultimately Easter.



#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

There have been several funerals so this has impacted Skinner's ability to get in and do the work.

- Still painting in the balcony
- Work being done on the arch. Hoping to get this done during the week so scaffolding not up for weekend services.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. Ann moved to approve as submitted and Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.

#### TREASURE'S REPORT:

A committee met to review Unbudgeted Benevolence. A printed list was provided to the council and is included in the Treasurer's report.

Pastor Steve recommended accounts labeled 7005 (Alpha Center), 7008 (Abundance of Love), 7018 (Community Meals), 7021 (Computers), 7026 (Jason Thompson -missionary), 7027 (Stewardship Workshop), and 7038 (Grief Share) be bundled under the title of Local Benevolence. Kaleb seconded the motion and motion passed.

The following funds would remain: 7009 (Youth Group), 7012 (Choir Music), 7015 (Capital Improvements), 7019 (PB & J Band), 7020 (Thrivent), 7024 (Hand Bell Choir - robe cleaning), 7034 ELCA Disaster Relief - Domestic), 7044 Courtyard Flagpole), 7036 (Audio/Visual)

Pastor Steve moved to change title of 7045 (Women of ELCA Group) to Joy Circle. Seconded by Kathy. Motion passed

Pastor Steve moved to move 7022 (Nativity Scene) to be included in 7025 (Christmas Decorations). Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed

Pastor Steve moved to move all but \$5000 from (7031) Senior Ministries to 7037 (Vision Funds) and then rename this as Church Building Upkeep. Kaleb seconded the motion. Motion passed.

7039 (Prepaid Wedding Receipts) will remain the same and the funds will return to reimburse the individuals that use this.

#### **STAFF REPORT:**

Pastor Report- Presented by Pastor Steve

3 funerals since the last council meeting.

Ash Wednesday services were well attended.

Pastor Steve and Stacy will be traveling May 7-9 but will return by Sunday for a baptism.

June 6-7 is the Synod Assembly at the African Event Center at Columbus Zoo. Registration is due

May 9. \$295/person and this is budgeted. 2 spots remain open (one male and one female)

- Ministry Music & Worship: Not present for meeting but Pastor Steve reminded council that Irish Strings will be playing next Sunday.
- Outreach Evangelism: Collecting Bibles. These are to be sent to eastern Ky. Requested that Pastor Steve include in announcements before services
- Outreach Parish Life: Working on Lenten meals. Ann made arrangements to get into the church at 4:30 to prep for the meals. Ann states that she got a letter for an outing for Dayton Dragons. This was not deemed practical since there was a 100 person minimum.
- Operations Finance: See Treasure report given by Dave.
- Operations Property: Archway above the main entrance exterior has some crumbling limestone. Josh is checking with some vendors to see what this repair would entail. Committee also looking for a feasible place to put a wheelchair ramp. Originally suggested west side but felt this was too far from the parking lot. It was suggested that the repair be combined with the addition of the ramp. Josh will look into this option, get some ideas and check cost. Kaleb suggested that funds could be used for the 100 year capital improvement.




