Our coat giveaway is on Saturday October 25 at 10:30-12:30. We are accepting gently used coats



Date: September 8, 2025

**CALL TO ORDER:** by President Myron Koester **OPENING DEVOTIONS:** Pastor Steve Edmiston

**AGENDA REVIEW:** Margy motioned to add to old business, discussion regarding the water fountains. Kaleb seconded the motion. Motion passed. Kaleb motioned to approve agenda as amended. Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

2026 Budget: Dave would like the council to begin to consider the budget. No significant changes are anticipated but notes this is hard to predict since some items are very difficult to predict. He will look at how this budget was handled last year. This budget will be presented to the congregation at the annual congregational meeting Nov 16 or 23. Dave asked the group to email him if there were any items of concern that needed to be addressed. Myron did ask Wes to be prepared to handle the congregational meeting, depending on the date, if he is on vacation.

- 1. Performed gravesite service for Jerry Gibbs
- 2. Pastor Steve and Stacy had a nice time picking up the car and have enjoyed driving it around.
- 3. Shelby County Historical Society is arranging a tour of 6 churches and several other locations that have housed churches in Sidney, including St. John's Lutheran Church, that have been a long time part of the community. Sept 21, 2025 and are anticipated to be at St. John's around 4:30. Will involve a walk through guided by Pastor Steve. If anyone would like to do this tour they will need to reserve a spot with Shelby Co. Historical Center but there is no cost. Must be prepared for a <u>walking</u> tour.
- 4. Brooks and Judy Ware recently had some power washing done at their home so have become aware of the need to have St. John's side walks power washed. They are offering to have the same individual, that did their work, do a quote and if not too terribly high, will pay to have done.
- 5. Pastor Steve's will need time off Oct.8-13 to go to his sister's memorial. Kermit and Kathy have voluteered to assist in this service.

Pastor Steve is working on getting a catechism group together.

Operations - Property:

\*Still working on details to repair limestone on front of church.

\*Had a meeting with Ron Eck (Eck Refrigeration, Inc). The boilers (4) are 40 yrs old and is operating at 60% efficiency. There is concern that some thought should be given to planning for replacement in the next 5 yrs. The A/C is also 25 yrs old. The pumps are getting quite old and the radiators are 70+ yrs old. Discussed a preventitive maintenance audit and it was felt that this should be done by Ron since he has performed the service for years and is well acquainted with the current system. Thought he might be able to give several options. Dave did point out that there were some funds for building upkeep but probably not sufficient for the entire job (depending on what was done repair vs replace, stick with boilers vs. forced air, etc). This subject will be announced/discussed to/with the congregation at the congregational meeting.

\*Bob has someone lined up to repair the interior paint (damaged with the roof issues) but is waiting to make sure there are no more leaks before this is done.




